


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TOWARD: In the direction of (**not necessarily in order to reach**) (Moving)



UNDER In a lower position than (Stationary)

UNDERNEATH In a place beneath (Stationary)

BELOW Lower than, beneath (Stationary)

UP From a lower to a higher position (Moving)



ABOVE Overhead; in a higher place (Stationary) Kristin stood <u>under</u> the bridge. Kristin stood <u>underneath</u> the bridge. Kristin stood <u>below</u> the bridge.

> UNDER UNDERNEATH BELOW

Emily chased Erin up the stairs.

Erin went to the floor <u>above</u> her dorm room. The sign hangs <u>above</u> the door.

ABOVE

The sign hangs <u>over</u> the door. (stationary) The cow jumped <u>over</u> the moon. (moving)

## OVER

At a position above (Stationary); or to go across above (Moving)

OVER OVER

WITH Accompanying; having

FOR Directed to; in order to go to Jeni went <u>with</u> Leslee to the convocation. The man <u>with</u> the puppet was there.

The letter is <u>for</u> Lisa. He went there <u>for</u> the party.

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Eddie ran toward the library.
