CHRISTMAS WITH WARTBURG 2000

Each December, Wartburg College presents Christmas with Wartburg as a musical gift to Iowa. We are pleased that you join us in this Advent and Christmas season as the Wartburg Choir, Castle Singers, Ritterchor, and Wind Ensemble present "O Come, O Come, Immanuel."

Christmas with Wartburg traces its beginnings to the early 1940s, when the Wartburg music department sponsored a civic Christmas concert in the Waverly High School auditorium. The production featured both college students and local elementary and secondary school groups. In 1947, the college presented its own program with the goal of starting a traditional holiday event. In 1951, the program was named Christmas at Wartburg. In the 1980s, when performances were added in Cedar Falls and Des Moines, the name was changed to Christmas with Wartburg.

Christmas with Wartburg offers audiences an opportunity to enter into the hope of Advent and celebration of Christmas and its announcement of God's good news. This year, amid unrest in the Middle East, a Palestinian hymn reminds us that Christmas is a time to put aside hatred and bury war. West Indian and African-American spirituals and voices echoing languages from around the world reflect the universality of the Christmas message.

The groups performing for Christmas with Wartburg are comprised of approximately 200 students, who represent nearly all academic disciplines on campus. The Wartburg Choir, Castle Singers, and Wind Ensemble make annual concert tours in the United States and periodic tours abroad. The Ritterchor (German for "Knights Choir") performs on campus and for selected off-campus events.


The Wind Ensemble will tour Europe next spring during the college's one-month May Term. The tour will include a performance at the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, Germany.

The Directors



Dr. Craig A. Hancock, director of bands and associate professor of music, directs the Wartburg College Wind Ensemble and the Symphonic Band, and teaches instrumental music courses, conducting, and tuba. He earned a Bachelor of Music degree from Simpson College. His Master of Arts and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees are from The University of Iowa. In addition to conducting and teaching, he makes frequent appearances as a clinician and adjudicator.



Dr. Paul Torkelson, director of choral activities and professor of music, directs the Wartburg Choir and the Castle Singers. A 1976 Wartburg graduate, he earned his Master of Music degree from Kansas State University and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Colorado. He is a frequent guest conductor for all-state choirs throughout the country. He was selected by the Music Educators National Conference as one of the top 12 outstanding music teachers from the state of Iowa.



Matthew J. Armstrong teaches music education methods and voice, conducts the Ritterchor, and serves as composer-in-residence at Wartburg. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree and Master of Arts in Education degree from Heidelberg College. He is pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Iowa. A professional composer since 1992, Armstrong has written more than 60 choral compositions, many of which are currently in publication. Two of his compositions and two of his arrangements are featured in this year's Christmas with Wartburg program.



The Rev. Dr. Walter "Chip" Bouzard Jr., assistant professor of religion, created this year's Christmas with Wartburg script. We worked with the music directors to integrate musical selections with the Gospel message of Christmas. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Texas-Austin, and master's degrees in divinity and theology from Luther Theological Seminary. His Ph.D. is from Princeton Theological Seminary in Old Testament studies.

Brich is a Master of Music recipient from the University of Northern Iowa, and has been on the adjunct voice faculty at Wartburg since 1992.



Robert Dunn has taught at Wartburg since 1989 as an adjunct instructor of music. He also teaches at the University of Northern Iowa, and has taught at Grinnell, Coe, and Clarke colleges. Dunn performs with flutist Dominique Cawley, also on the Wartburg faculty, and is a frequent performer on jazz guitar and jazz bass.

Rich Heritage

Wartburg College is a four-year liberal arts college of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Founded in 1852, it is named after the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, Germany, where Martin Luther found refuge during the stormy days of the Reformation.

Many college traditions are based on the castle heritage. Athletic teams are called the Knights. Band, choir, and orchestra festivals for selected high school students are named after the meistersinger music competitions held at the Wartburg Castle during the Middle Ages. Summer Meistersinger All-State Music Camps prepare high school vocalists for the Iowa All-State competition.

Wartburg has set enrollment records in each of the past five years. This year's enrollment of 1,600 includes students from 27 U.S. states and the District of Columbia, as well as 70 international students from 28 countries.

Wartburg is listed among the country's top 160 liberal arts colleges in *U.S. News & World Report's* annual survey. Peterson's *Top Colleges for Science* identifies Wartburg as one of 200 colleges offering outstanding undergraduate programs in science and mathematics. Wartburg was one of only two Iowa colleges on *Yahoo! Internet Life* magazine's list of the country's 50 "most wired" national liberal arts colleges.
