About the New York Schools

PS 155

Located in East Harlem, this school has a strong academic focus.

PS 163

This K-5th program is located in East Harlem. It has talent/gifted program, as well as a bilingual program.

Central Park East

The fine arts are emphasized at this school where many grade level combinations are used.

Ethical Culture

Established in 1878, this school is built upon ethics. The school is located across from Central Park and uses the city as a place for learning.

Manhattan Center

This school has high expectations for the students. Each year many more students apply for admission than the school can accept.

Head Start Program

This bilingual early childhood program is located in East Harlem.

CJHS #145

Located near Yankee Stadium, this school is very diverse with nearly 1200 students.

What Should I Expect?

When do we go?

The field experience occurs during May Term at Wartburg College. Students are usually away from campus approximately 10 days. Students will note that there is a time zone difference of one hour from Iowa to New York.

How do we get to New York?

Transportation to New York is by air.

Where do we stay once we are in the Big Apple?

Students and chaperones stay at the Seafarers and International House in downtown New York. A mix of single and double rooms are available. The Seafarers and International House has a fair rate that helps lessen the cost of the trip for students.

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
