

## Social Work Major Intended Student Learning Outcomes

## Students will:

- 1. identify with the social work profession and demonstrate behaviors expected of entry level practitioners.
- 2. act and practice in a manner that demonstrates a thorough understanding of professional social work ethical principles.
- 3. demonstrate the competent application of critical thinking to the practice of social work and an ability to communicate effectively.
- 4. reflect an appreciation for the value and importance of human diversity (gender, ethnicity, social class, sexual orientation, disability, spirituality, and age) in their practices.
- 5. demonstrate an appreciation for the social work profession's commitment to social and economic justice and an understanding of our ethical obligations to work towards these ends.
- 6. demonstrate research skills that enable them to critically evaluate practice and outcomes; their practice will reflect the use of relevant research findings.
- 7. evidence due regard for principles and theories of human behavior and the social environment through their practices.
- 8. demonstrate a willingness and ability to incorporate social policy practice with their professional work.
- 9. demonstrate a capacity for embracing the ever evolving changes that affect their practice of social work.
- 10. demonstrate beginning social work practice skills with individuals and families.
