## Memorandum of Agreement

## Wartburg College and Kirkwood Community College

The signatures on this document attest to a collaborative agreement between the Wartburg College and Kirkwood Community College to accept full transfer of Kirkwood's Associate Arts: Technical Communications (major) to Wartburg College and into the transfer college's Communications: Public Relations major with third-year status. This agreement is consistent with the already established general articulation and acceptance of Kirkwood's Associate Arts Degree into Wartburg College. That general articulation provides for course-by course articulation (Kirkwood to Wartburg) for all general education, core, and elective courses at Kirkwood that can be used to fulfill requirements for the Associate Arts Degree at Kirkwood. An attachment listing the courses identified for the Technical Communications major has been provided.

This articulation agreement shall be effective from the date indicated below and will be in force until terminated by either institution with one year's notice. The following signatures, representing Kirkwood Community College and Wartburg College affirm that this agreement is mutually accepted.

## The Terms of the Agreement are as follows:

- 1. Wartburg College agrees to accept the Associate of Arts degree (62 credit hours) from Kirkwood Community College for all Kirkwood transfers into Wartburg College's Communication Arts (Public Relations) major with third-year status.
- 2. The colleges will communicate as necessary on any changes or revisions to their respective curricula.
- 3. Kirkwood Community College agrees to assist and facilitate the transfer process of those students completing the complimentary major at Wartburg College.
- 4. The Dean of English at Kirkwood Community College will be the contact person for Technical Communications at Kirkwood. The Assistant Registrar will be the contact person at Wartburg College.
- 5. Both colleges are committed to a quality program and will regularly seek ways for improving their respective curricula and will continue striving to meet the needs of their common students.
