Memorandum of Agreement

Wartburg College And Hawkeye Community College

The signatures on this document attest to a collaborative agreement between Wartburg College and Hawkeye Community College to accept full transfer of Hawkeye's Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts – Social Sciences Track (major) to Wartburg College and into the transfer college's Social Work major with third-year status. That general articulation provides for course-by-course articulation (Hawkeye to Wartburg) for all general education, core, and elective courses at Hawkeye that can be used to fulfill requirements for the Associate in Arts Degree at Hawkeye.

The Terms of the Agreement are as follows:

- 1. Students successfully completing an AA degree at Hawkeye, including lower division course work for a particular program, will transfer as third-year students (18.25 course credits out of 36 needed to graduate). Students will be treated the same as students who began their studies at Wartburg and will be reasonably assured of completing the bachelor's degree program in an additional two years.
- 2. IS 101 Inquiry Studies, IS 201 Living in a Diverse World, and one Faith and Reflection course in the Wartburg Plan of Essential Education are considered fulfilled with the associate degree. To fulfill general education, major, minor and elective requirements toward a Bachelor of Arts degree, Hawkeye courses will be evaluated according to the articulation agreement between Wartburg College and Hawkeye. Courses in which less than a C- has been earned may not be used to fulfill specific requirements. Students with an associate degree will have most, but not all, general education requirements fulfilled. Hawkeye students will use the catalog requirements of the year in which they matriculate. They should check with the Wartburg College Registrar's Office to confirm graduation requirements.
- 3. The colleges will communicate as necessary on any changes or revisions to their respective curricula.
- 4. Hawkeye agrees to assist and facilitate the transfer process of those students completing the complimentary major at Wartburg College.
- Lisa Ciesielski, Academic Advisor at Hawkeye, will be the contact person for communications at Hawkeye Community College and the Registrar will be the contact person at Wartburg College.
- Both colleges are committed to a quality program and will regularly seek ways for improving their respective curricula and will continue striving to meet the needs of their common students.

7. This articulation agreement shall be effective from the date indicated below and will be in force for three years or until terminated by either institution with one year's notice. The following signatures, representing Hawkeye and Wartburg College affirm that this agreement is mutually accepted.

The course credit is the unit of academic credit used at Wartburg College. Most course credits are equivalent to 3.5 semester hours. Thirty-six (36) course credits are required for graduation. A maximum of twenty-two (22) course credits may be transferred from two-year colleges. Students receiving an associate degree from a community college will receive eighteen (18) course credits of transfer credit. Wartburg requires a minimum of one year in residence which is defined as 7 of the last 9 credits must be earned at Wartburg College.

The grade for courses must be at least C- to transfer. Courses graded P will not transfer unless the letter grade equivalent is C- or better. Grades earned in courses taken at other institutions do NOT count in the Wartburg grade point average.
