Terms of Payment

Monthly statements are made available via my.wartburg.edu and **Transact**, formerly CASHNNet. Payments are due by Sept. 10 for Fall Term, Feb. 10 for Winter Term, and July 10 for Summer Term. Charges over 30 days old are subject to a finance charge. Payments can be made via cash, check, money order, bank wire, Flywire, or Transact. Monthly payment plans also are available. Student Payment Agreement (SPA)

The Student Payment Agreement is a legal document that explains the financial responsibilities of students attending classes at Wartburg College. The SPA explains Wartburg College's terms of payment and policies related to past-due accounts. The SPA also documents Wartburg College's rights and remedies related to collecting past-due accounts. Wartburg College requires each student to sign a SPA prior to registering for classes. The payment of tuition, fees, and all other charges become an obligation of the student at the time of registration. It is important to keep a copy of this signed form for your records. Financial Aid

Graduate students may qualify for a maximum of \$20,500 in Federal Direct Graduate Unsubsidized Loans per academic year with a lifetime limit of \$138,500. For information about Federal Direct Loan Program such as interest rates, origination fees, or to complete the FAFSA go to www.studentaid.gov.

Optional Housing and Food Fees

Graduate students can select from the following optional housing and food plans when living on campus.

Housing assignments are made by the Residential Life Office. Graduate students interested in living on campus should complete a housing application. All listed room costs are at least double occupancy. A limited number of single rooms are available for an additional charge.

All students living in campus residences are required to have a meal plan. Meal plans are charged at the full amount, with any unused points rolling from one term to the next through May Term. Any unused points at the end of May Term are nonrefundable. A special six-meal plan applies only to Knights Village residents.
