

➣ The Wartburg Choir <</p>

Founded in 1937, the internationally acclaimed Wartburg Choir performs sacred music from all historical periods and styles and often features premiere works of contemporary composers, including Morten Lauridsen, Eriks Ešenvalds, Ola Gjeilo, René Clausen, Stacey V. Gibbs, Tom Trenney, and Connor Koppin, a 2013 Wartburg College graduate. Choir members are chosen by audition and represent most academic disciplines on campus. The choir makes annual concert tours throughout the United States and travels abroad every three years during the college's one-month May Term. For 80 years the choir has toured domestically and internationally, visiting more than 25 European countries, Scandinavia, South Africa, and three Canadian provinces. The Wartburg Choir is the college's select a cappella choir, one of five choirs offered through the music department.

The choir was founded under the direction of Dr. Edwin Liemohn who was a student of F. Melius Christiansen. The Wartburg Choir was one of the first American college choral groups to perform a European tour. Dr. James Fritschel continued this tradition of excellence from 1968 to 1984 by expanding the choir's international exposure. During his tenure, the choir became the only American choral group to win the International Trophy Competition in Cork, Ireland. Dr. Paul Torkelson directed the choir from 1984 to 2009. Music critic Cecelia Porter of the *Washington Post* described his work with the choir as "a mighty fortress of skill ... a chorus trained with rock-solid discipline, impeccable intonation, and excellent diction." In 2009, Dr. Lee Nelson became the fourth conductor of the Wartburg Choir. His efforts have increased the awareness and reputation of the choir. The group is in high demand for premieres of new compositions and continues to be praised by critics wherever it appears.

Under Nelson's direction, the Wartburg Choir worked with composer Morten Lauridsen, who lauded its performance of his *O Magnum Mysterium* as being "in the top echelon of any performance of that piece by any choir that I have ever heard." The Wartburg Choir performed at the 2012 and 2014 North Central division of the American Choral Directors Association (NCACDA) conferences. The choir has performed two other times at the NCACDA and twice at National American Choral Directors Association conferences. In 2011, the choir was invited to perform on the Holiday Concert Series at the White House in Washington, D.C. The choir has performed with opera star Simon Estes at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis, Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., Lincoln Center in New York, Orchestra Hall at Symphony Center in Chicago, and performed two concerts with the Czech National Symphony Orchestra in Prague.

The choir has appeared at Lincoln Center's Avery Fisher Hall in New York and performed multiple solo concerts at Carnegie Hall. A 1999 lowa Public Television production of the Wartburg Choir at the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, Germany, was broadcast on public television stations throughout the United States. It marked the first performance ever taped for television at the historic castle, where Martin Luther took refuge during the stormy days of the Protestant Reformation. In May, the Wartburg Choir will travel to Germany, Scotland, and Ireland on a 30-day international performance tour during which the college will tape a new documentary in celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation.

Der international anerkannte Wartburg Choir präsentiert Kirchenmusik aus allen historischen Epochen und debütiert regelmäßig Werke von zeitgenössischen Komponisten wie Morten Lauridsen, Ola Gjeilo, Ben Allaway, Stacey V. Gibbs, Stanfort Scriven und Connor Koppin, einem 2013 Absolventen des Colleges. Chormitglieder werden nach einem Vorsingen ausgewählt und vertreten sämtliche akademische Fakultäten des Colleges. Der Chor unternimmt jedes Jahr Touren durch die Vereinigten Staaten und reist jedes dritte Jahr ins Ausland. In den vergangenen acht Jahrzehnten ist der Chor in mehr als 25 europäischen Ländern, Süd-Afrika und Kanada aufgetreten. Der Wartburg Choir ist ein selektiver A Capella Chor und einer von fünf Chören des Musikdezernats.

Der Wartburg Choir wurde 1937 von Dr. Edwin Liemohn gegründet. Liemohn war ein Schüler F. MeliusChristansens. Der Chor war einer der ersten amerikanischen Chöre, der eine Europatournee unternahm. Dr. James Fritschel führte die hervorragende Tradition des Chores zwischen 1968-1984 durch den Ausbau seiner internationalen Präsenz fort. Unter seiner Leitung belegte der Wartburg Choir als erster amerikanische Chor den ersten Platz beim International Choral Festival in Cork, Ireland. Dr. Paul Torkelson leitete den Chor von 1984 bis 2009. Seine Chöre bekamen internationale Anerkennung für Vielseitigkeit und Präzision. Musikkritikerin Cecelia Porter beschrieb den Chor als "eine mächtige Festung an Können." Sie sagte weiter, es handle sich um "einen Chor geschult mit solider Disziplin [...] Der Chor besitzt einwandfreie Intonation und exzellente Artikulation". Seit 2009 ist Dr. Lee Nelson Chorleiter. Unter seiner Führung gewann der Wartburg Choir an Anerkennung und Prominenz. Die Gruppe ist äußerst gefragt für Premier neuer Stücke, und der Chor genießt Lob wannimmer er auftritt. gewinnen können. Seine Bemühungen fruchteten in größerer Bekanntheit und Anerkennung des Chors. Die Gruppe ist äußerst gefragt für Premieren neuer Stücke und der Chor erntet Lob wann immer er auftritt.

Nach Kollaboration mit Morten Lauridsen im Januar lobte der Komponist den Chor für die Interpretation seines *O Magnum Mysterium* als "eine der besten Versionen dieses Stückes, die ich je gehört habe". In 2012 und 2014 trat der Wartburg Choir bei der Konferenz der North Central Division of American Choral Directors Association (NCACDA) auf. Davor war der Chor bereits zweimal sowohl auf der NCACDA Konferenz wie auch auf der National American Choral Director Association Tagung eingeladen. Der Chor sang 2011 auf Einladung im Weißen Haus und in der Washington National Cathedral. Opernstar Simon Estes trat mit dem Wartburg Choir in der Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis, Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. und im Lincoln Center in New York auf. Sie präsentierten auch zwei Konzerte in Prag mit dem Tschechischen Nationalen Symphonieorchester.

Zu den zahlreichen weiteren Auftritten des Chors zählen unter anderem zwei in der Avery Fisher Hall des Lincoln Centers in New York, wie auch mehrere Solo-Konzerte in Carnegie Hall. Das 1999 Konzert des Wartburg Choirs auf der Wartburg in Eisenach wurde von verschiedenen öffentlichen Fernsehprogrammen in den USA ausgestrahlt und war das erste, das jemals auf der Burg, wo Martin Luther Zuflucht fand, für das Fernsehen gefilmt wurde. Im Mai reist der Chor nach Deutschland, Schottland, und Irland auf eine vier-wöchige Tournee, wobei ein Dokumentarfilm der 500. Jubiläumsfeier der Reformation aufgenommen wird.





Dr. Lee Nelson is the Patricia R. Zahn Chair in Choral Conducting and director of choral activities at Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa, USA. Nelson conducts The Wartburg Choir and Ritterchor (men's choir) and teaches beginning and advanced conducting and literature. He also serves as the artistic director of Christmas with Wartburg. Wartburg College recognized Nelson's work by awarding him the John O. Chellevold Award for Excellence in Teaching and Service in 2012.

Under Nelson's direction, The Wartburg Choir has performed nationally and internationally, including an unprecedented performance at the White House and the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. Choirs under his direction have performed at state, regional, and national ACDA conferences in 2007, 2012, 2014, and 2017. Composer Morten Lauridsen praised Nelson and the Wartburg Choir's performance of *O Magnum Mysterium* stating: "It was in the top echelon of any performance of that piece by any choir that I have ever heard." Nelson will be conducting The Wartburg Choir on a 30-day international tour to Germany, Scotland, and Ireland in May.

Nelson has conducted all-state and honor choirs throughout the United States and Canada. He was invited to conduct the National Festival Chorus at Carnegie Hall in 2011, 2012, and 2014. In February, Nelson conducted a 270-voice choir and orchestra in a performance of Randall Thompson's *Testament of Freedom* for a President's Day concert at Carnegie Hall.

Earlier in his career, Nelson received the Outstanding Young Choral Conductor of the Year, awarded by ACDA of Minnesota. In 2005, Nelson won the National ACDA Graduate Conducting Competition in Los Angeles. Nelson earned a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Concordia College and a Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Arizona.

Dr. Lee Nelson hat den Patricia R. Zahn Lehrstuhl in Chorleitung und ist der Direktor für Chorangelegenheiten am Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa, USA. Nelson dirigiert den Wartburg Chor und den Ritterchor (Männerchor). Außerdem lehrt er Dirigieren und dient dem College als künstlerischer Leiter von Christmas with Wartburg. Im Jahre 2012 wurde er mit dem John O. Chellevold Award for Excellence in Teaching and Professional Service geehrt.

Unter Nelsons Leitung tritt der Chor regelmässig in den USA und im Ausland auf, darunter eine eindrucksvolle Aufführung im Weißen Haus und in der Washington National Cathedral in Washington D.C. In den Jahren 2007, 2012, 2014, und 2017 trat der Chor bei der Konferenz der North Central Division of American Choral Directors Association und auf der National ACDA Tagung auf. Der Komponist Morten Lauridsen lobte den Chor für die Interpretation seines *O Magnum Mysterium* "als eine der besten Versionen dieses Stückes, die ich je gehört habe." Der Chor, unter Nelsons Leitung, geht im Mai auf eine vier-wöchige Tournee nach Deutschland, Schottland, und Irland.

Nelson arbeitete mit einigen der besten Chöre der Vereinigten Staaten und Kanada. In den Jahren 2011, 2012, und 2014 wurde er zum Carnegie Hall eingeladen, um den National Festival Chorus zu dirigieren. Im Februar dirigierte Nelson einen 270-stimmigen Chor mit Orchester in einer President's Day Aufführung von Randall Thompsons *Testament of Freedom* in Carnegie Hall.

Schon früh in seiner Karriere war Nelson mit dem Outstanding Young Choral Conductor of the Year durch die Minnesota ACDA ausgezeichnet worden. Im Jahre 2005 hatte er die National ACDA Conducting Competition in Los Angeles gewonnen. Lee Nelson erwarb den Bachelor in Musik am Concordia College, und promovierte an der University of Arizona.



Wartburg ist ein, besonders für sein soziales Engagement, international anerkanntes, selektives, privates Liberal Arts College der Evangelisch-Lutherischen Kirche in Amerika. Die Studenten des Colleges kommen aus 58 verschiedenen Ländern und 28 US-Staaten. Wartburg widmet sich der Herausforderung und Förderung von Führungsqualitäten und Dienstbereitschaft als einen dynamischen Ausdruck ihres Glaubens und Lernens.

Obwohl Wartburg ein breites Angebot an musikalischen Studiengängen (unter anderem Lehramt, Musiktherapie, Kirchenmusik) bietet, sind in den 15 Ensembles des Colleges alle Studenten willkommen.

Während des einmonatigen Semesters im Mai, touren der Wartburg Choir, das Blasorchester und die Castle Singers und jedes dritte Jahr reisen sie in dieser Zeit im Ausland. Auf Staatsebene ausgezeichnete Musiker und Teilnehmer des Lutheran Summer Music Programms erhalten für ihr Studium am Wartburg College ein Stipendium von mindestens 2.500 US-Dollar (1.800 Euro). Meistersinger Music Stipendien im Wert von bis zu 5.000 US-Dollar (3.600 Euro) werden an Musikund Nicht-Musikstudenten vergeben.

Wartburg is a selective liberal arts college of the Lutheran Church (ELCA) in Waverly, lowa, USA, internationally recognized for community engagement. The college's 1,482 students come from 58 countries and 28 U.S. states. Wartburg is dedicated to challenging and nurturing students for lives of leadership and service as a spirited expression of their faith and learning.

Wartburg offers more than 50 academic majors, including music education, performance, music therapy, and church music. The college's 15 vocal and instrumental music ensembles are open to music and nonmusic majors. The Wartburg Choir, Wind Ensemble, and Castle Singers tour annually and travel abroad every third year during the college's one-month May Term.

All-State musicians and Lutheran Summer Music participants who enroll at Wartburg qualify for a minimum of \$2,500 in scholarships. Meistersinger Music Scholarships offer up to \$5,000 per year to music and nonmusic majors, based on audition.

Wartburg takes its name from the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, Germany, where Martin Luther took refuge for 10 months during the stormy days of the Protestant Reformation. Music groups frequently visit the castle during their May Term trips abroad.
